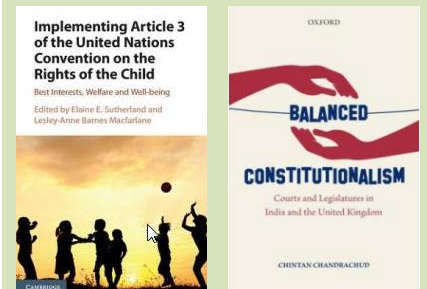

## Latest in Open Access

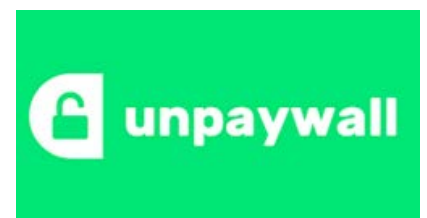
**Unpaywall** is a Chrome extension that finds OA versions of articles: "When an Unpaywall user lands on the page of a research article, the software scours thousands of institutional repositories, preprint servers, and websites like PubMed Central to see if an open-access copy of the article is available. If it is, users can click a small green tab on the side of the screen to view a PDF."
