

Did you know HeinOnline has Canadian legislation?

Legal researchers often search HeinOnline for legal journal articles, but did you know that you can also find digitized pre-confederation and historical Canadian and provincial statutes on the platform?

On the homepage of HeinOnline, access our Canadian legislation from the top left link "Canadian Content" in the "Browse Databases by Category".



Like using journal articles on HeinOnline, you can output full PDFs or extracts of each statute. You can also generate a permalink to a specific page which can be shared with other U of T researchers and students.
