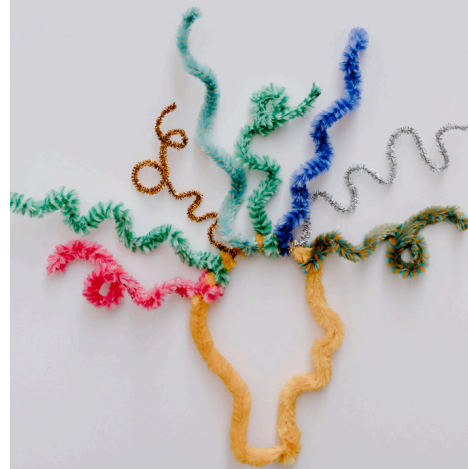

## COAL – Canadian Open Access Legal Citation Guide

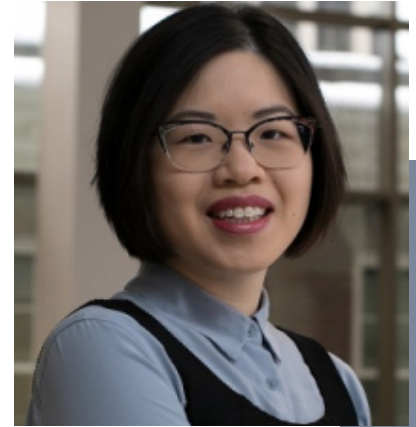

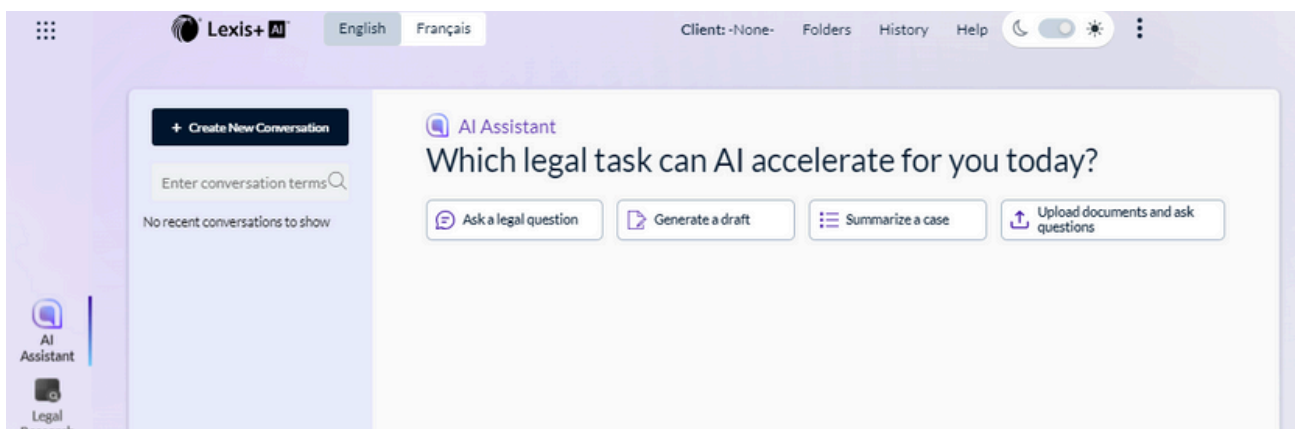


## ICYMI: Lexis+ AI, rolling out to students this fall

LexisNexis Canada is rolling out the new Lexis+ AI tool to students, starting September 3. AI Assistant allows users to ask it a legal question, draft memos, summarize cases, and more.

**As of July 30, Faculty users have early access to the AI Assistant and can [register for online Faculty training sessions from August 7-29](#).**

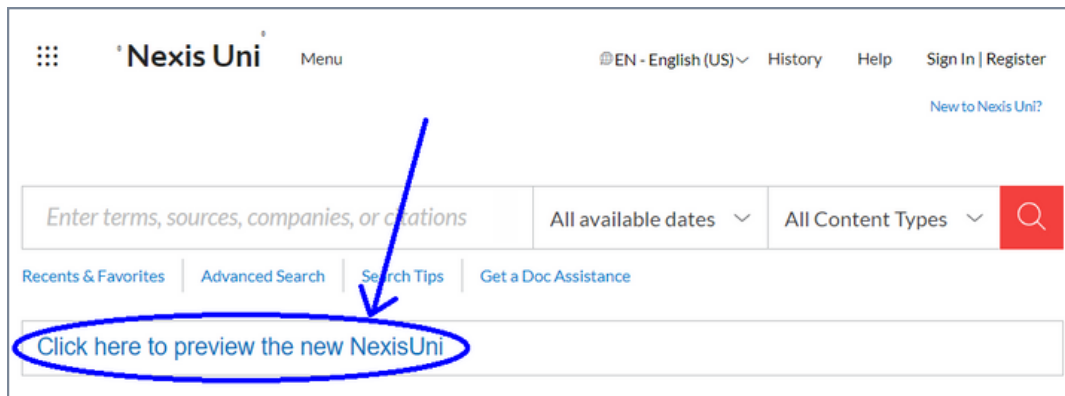
## e-Laws: Have your say on the interface

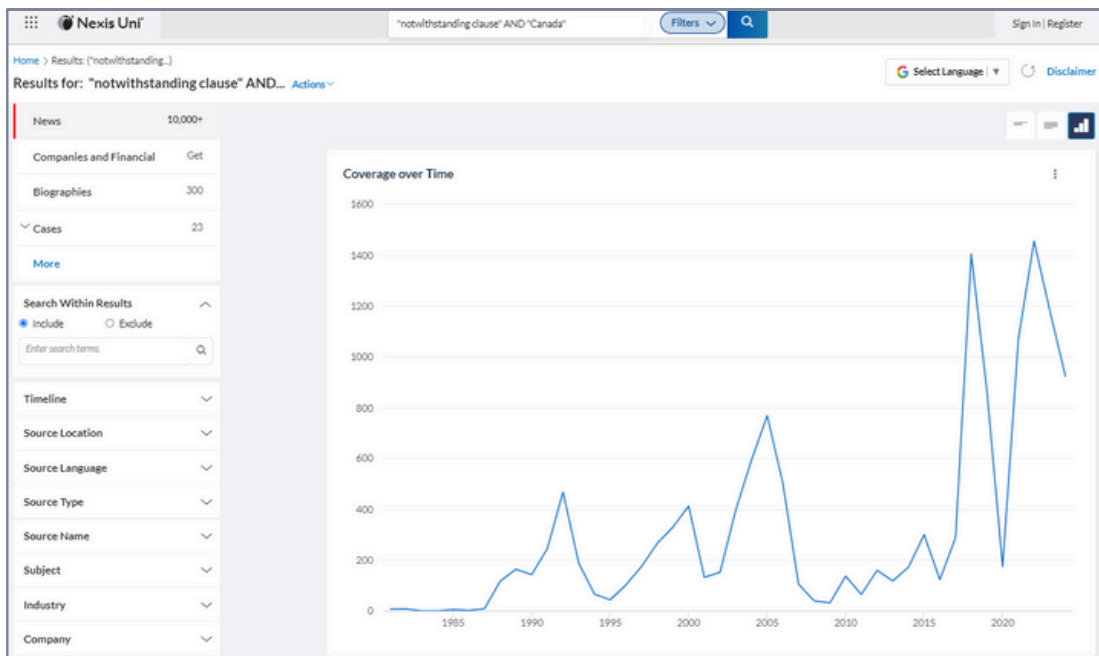

## Nexis Uni: Upgraded interface

Nexis Uni, formerly Lexis Academic, is upgrading its interface soon – date TBA. LexisNexis paused the update planned for early July, but users can toggle between both versions for now. If you're already a Lexis+ user, Nexis Uni holds similar content but is designed for academic users and business researchers. Nexis Uni prioritizes research articles and offers visualization tools for viewing search results. Business researchers can easily perform searches on company profiles, SEC filings and more.

## OUP Law: Migration to Oxford Academic

eBooks on some OUP Law products will be migrated to the Oxford Academic platform starting July 30 and ending on August 13. Products affected include:

- Oxford Competition Law
- Investment Claims
- Oxford Scholarly Authorities on International Law
- Oxford Legal Research Library
  - Financial and Banking Law
  - International Commercial Law
  - International Commercial Arbitration
  - Private International Law

Also, “non-book” content from Investment Claims and Oxford Competition Law will be retired.

What you need to do:

- If you made a personal account or saved any searches, they will not be carried over to the new platform. Please note any search terms prior to August 13.
- If you have bookmarks pointing to affected products, you will be redirected to the new platform once migration is complete. We recommend updating them after the migration is completed.
