This Research Guide is designed to help researchers manage their citations using Jurism.

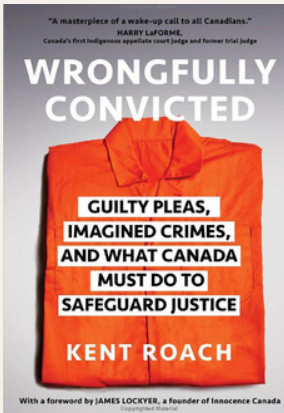
Jurism is a variant of the more well-known Zotero. Like Zotero, it is a free, open-source research tool that assists researchers collect, manage, edit and share their work. Jurism is specifically designed to handle legal citations and is capable of generating the McGill Guide citation format, and can accommodate a wide range of legal materials.
