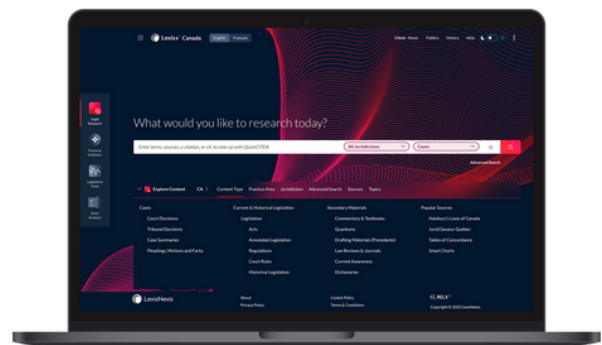

Declassified Documents Online: 20th Century British Intelligence (Part 1) includes files from different UK government departments and documents the intelligence services of Britain over the 20th century.

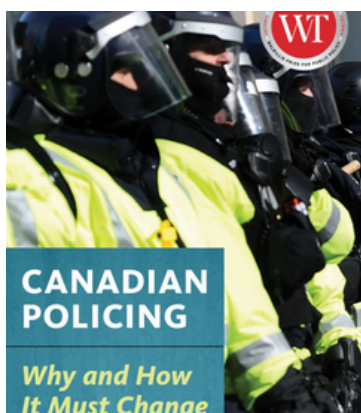

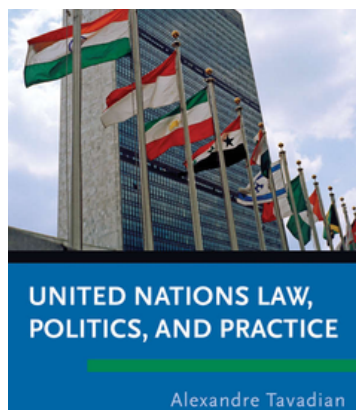
