

Sackheouse, a Greenlandic Eskimo who served Ross as an interpreter, shows Captains John Ross and Edward Parry with the 'wild people,' or Arctic Highlanders as Ross named them, in Northern Greenland, at the outset of the British nineteenth-century search for the Northwest Passage.

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
